

KING JAMES SUMMER SHOWCASE RULES

The National High School Federation Rules and Regulations will apply to all tournament games with the following exceptions: All USSSA rules may not apply in this tournament, see tournament director for clarification.

All games will be played in quarters for 3rd, 4th, 5th, & 6th and halves for 7th through 11 grades

9u/3rd Grade Division	6 minutes
10u/4th Grade Division	6 minutes
11u/5th Grade Division	6 minutes
12u/6th Grade Division	6 minutes
13u/7th Grade Division	14 minutes
14u/8th Grade Division	14 minutes
15u/9th Grade Division	14 minutes
16u/10th Grade Division	16 minutes
17u/11th Grade Division	16 minutes

Halftime shall be no longer than 3 minutes. At least a five-minute pre-game warm up will be given unless games are running behind schedule. No games will start before their scheduled time. Overtime period will be two minutes. **The third overtime period will end in sudden death.**

1. A player will be disqualified after committing a 6th personal foul (technical fouls are included) in the 15u through 17u age brackets. A player will be disqualified after committing a 5th personal foul in all other age brackets.
2. A total of (3) time-outs per game will be allowed to each team. One (1) additional time-out per team will be awarded for each overtime period. There will be no carry-over of time-outs from regulation to overtime periods. 3. Regulation sized basketballs will be used for boy's 13u/7th grade division through High School Division. All other divisions in boys and girls competition will use the smaller sized basketball.
4. Two (2) Technical fouls during a game on any player, coach, or team representative will result in their disqualification for the rest of the game.
5. The clock will be stopped for all whistle stoppages. Not a continuous clock.

6. The One & One Bonus will start after the 10th team fouls each half. No Double Bonus.
7. Each team is responsible for their warm-up and game balls and/or any other items brought to the game. The tournament sponsors or their representatives are not responsible for lost items.
8. 20 points+ leads will result in continuous clock until lead is less than 20 points.
9. Officials and site directors must contact the executive staff before any game will be called a forfeit.
10. Protests – If a team submits a protest of an opponent for the use of an illegal player the protesting team must give the protest in writing along with a \$100 to the site director within 10 minutes of the completion of the game they are protesting. The protesting team's \$100 will be refunded if the protest is upheld and forfeited if the protest is not upheld. Teams who have a protest filed against them must produce birth certificates and/or grade reports for the player in question to the site director within 30 minutes from the time the protest is filed to proceed in the tournament. A final decision will be made by the Tournament Director and will not be subject to any further discussion.

Tiebreaker for play-offs:

1. **Head to Head**
2. **Point differential**...Maximum 15 points. (Forfeits are scored at 15-0) Point differential calculation is based solely on the games between the tied teams. In the event of a three-way tie for **first**, point differential will be used to establish the **pool winner**.

The head to head game between the remaining two teams will determine the runner-up position.

3. **Defensive Point System-** If 3 teams remain tied after the above tie breakers the team with the lowest total points allowed will advance. The remaining teams will revert back to tie breaker #1

Eligibility:

1. A photocopy of that portion of the athletes' report card for the current school year which shows name, grade and school.
2. Confirmation of grade level from a school administrator (guidance counselor, principal, dean, etc.) on school letterhead

BIRTH RECORDS: Each competitor must have a proof of his age and be able to produce such information in one of the following acceptable manners:

HOSPITAL RECORDS ARE UNACCEPTABLE!

- a) A **COPY** of his birth record from the STATE, COUNTY, OR MUNICIPAL BUREAU OF VITAL STATISTICS from the place of birth. (the KJSSC is not responsible for returning original birth records).

- b) A copy of the delayed registration of birth if the athlete's birth was not recorded on his day of birth, issued by the same governing bodies.
- c) An un-expired Passport
- d) A valid divers License, State issued ID or School Issued ID

ELIGIBILITY Any questions pertaining to the eligibility of a player or team shall be directed to the Tournament Director.

9u/3rd Grade - An athlete must be in the 3rd grade as of October 1, 2010 and can be no older than 10 on August 31, 2011. For an athlete that is in the 4th grade as of October 1st, 2010 wanting to petition to play down, in the 3rd grade division they can be no older than 9 on August 31, 2011

10u/4th Grade - An athlete must be in the 4th grade as of October 1, 2010 and can be no older than 11 on August 31, 2011. For an athlete that is in the 5th grade as of October 1st, 2010 wanting to petition to play down, in the 4th grade division they can be no older than 10 on August 31, 2011

11u/5th Grade - An athlete must be in the 5th grade as of October 1, 2010 and can be no older than 12 on August 31, 2011. For an athlete that is in the 6th grade as of October 1st, 2010 wanting to petition to play down, in the 5th grade division they can be no older than 11 on August 31, 2011

12u/6th Grade - An athlete must be in the 6th grade as of October 1, 2010 and can be no older than 13 on August 31, 2011. For an athlete that is in the 7th grade as of October 1st, 2010 wanting to petition to play down, in the 6th grade division they can be no older than 12 on August 31, 2011

13u/7th grade - An athlete must be in the 7th grade as of October 1, 2010 and can be no older than 14 on August 31, 2011. For an athlete that is in the 8th grade as of October 1st, 2010 wanting to petition to play down, in the 7th grade division they can be no older than 13 on August 31, 2011

14u/8th grade - An athlete must be in the 8th grade as of October 1, 2010 and can be no older than 15 on August 31, 2011. For an athlete that is in the 9th grade as of October 1st, 2010 wanting to petition to play down, in the 8th grade division they can be no older than 14 on August 31, 2011.

15u/9th Grade - An athlete must be in the 9th grade as of October 1, 2010 and can be no older than 16 on August 31, 2011. For an athlete that is in the 10th grade as of October 1st, 2010 wanting to petition to play down, in the 9th grade division they can be no older than 15 on August 31, 2011

16u/10th grade - An athlete must be in the 10th grade as of October 1, 2010 and can be no older than 17 on August 31, 2011 For an athlete that is in the 11th grade as of October 1st, 2010 wanting to petition to play down, in the 10th grade division they can be no older than 16 on August 31, 2011

17u/11TH Grade - An athlete must be in the 11th grade as of October 1, 2010 can be no older than 18 on August 31, 2011. For an athlete that is in the 12th grade as of October 1st, 2010 wanting to petition to play down, in the 11th grade division they can be no older than 17 on August 31, 2011

All Canadian teams will follow the age groupings they play under in Canada. I've listed below the Canadian Age Groups for 2010.

Novice U10 (Under 10, Born in 2001 or younger)

Atom U11 (Under 11, Born in 2000 or younger)

Major Atom U12 (Under 12, Born in 1999 and younger)

Bantam U13 (Under 13, Born in 1998 or younger)

Major Bantam U14 (Under 14, Born in 1997 or younger)

Midget U15 (Under 15, Born in 1996 or younger)

Major Midget U16 (Under 16, Born in 1995 or younger)

Juvenile U17 (Under 17, Born in 1994 or younger)
